Visit to The CARE Clinic Saves Life

Bonnie had to cut her career short when her mom became very ill. Retiring early to drive her mom to doctor appointments in Charlotte left her uninsured. When Bonnie began feeling bad, she spoke with her mom's doctor and he said that he would treat her. It was determined that she had high blood pressure but after some time, the amount of money she was paying to see her new doctor was more than she could afford. One day while discussing her situation with a friend, she was fortunate to learn about The CARE Clinic. Bonnie called right away and made an appointment to be seen so that she could get her needed medications at no cost. At her appointment she began telling the doctor some new symptoms she was having and a blood test was ordered. The results of the bloodwork confirmed multiple myeloma. Bonnie was referred out for treatment. "If it wasn't for The CARE Clinic, I don't know if the cancer would have been detected. I have insurance now so The CARE Clinic can't see me anymore. There are a bunch of good ladies that work there." said Bonnie.

Operation Round Up Grant Received

Operation Round Up is a voluntary program for South River Electric Membership Corporation members to have your electric bill rounded up to the next whole dollar. The extra change is deposited into the Operation Round Up Fund. The South River Community Assistance Corporation (CAC), a nonprofit foundation, oversees the distribution of funds. An independent board of directors, made up of community leaders, governs the CAC and the distribution of funds. The funds are given primarily to organizations that are serving either the health, safety, educational or recreational needs of citizens within our service area. Nonprofit agencies in Harnett, Cumberland, Sampson, Johnston and Bladen counties may apply for up to \$5,000 annually to implement programs or purchase needed equipment to facilitate a program, which will help in our local communities. We are pleased to announce that The CARE Clinic received a \$5,000 grant this year. Thank you to the CAC for selecting The CARE Clinic and to the members that chose to "Round Up."

COVID-19 Update

As the Coronavirus hit our community, it had a large impact on The CARE Clinic. On March 17 we closed all dental clinics and on March 30 we closed all medical clinics. In April we canceled seven day clinics, sixteen night medical clinics, nine dental clinics and nine specialty clinics. We continued to provide needed medications for our established patients as our staff worked partially at the Clinic and partially from home. We currently have all clinics operating with strict measures to keep our patients, volunteers and staff safe. Thank you to all of our volunteers and donors who continue to support us during these challenging times.



The CARE Clinic earned a 2020 Gold Rating from the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics (NAFC) Quality Standards Program. The mission of the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics is to ensure the medically underserved have access to affordable health care.
