A Patient's Story

Isaiah 57:14

"Build up, build up, prepare the road! Remove the obstacles out of the way of my people."

For this is what the high and exalted One says— he who lives forever, whose name is holy.

Through patience, love, and understanding, God will lead his people through life's challenges. At The CARE Clinic, we work with patients who face many obstacles when it comes to receiving basic medical care.

Maria and her daughter are two people who understand what it takes to push through hurdles. Mrs. Maria is a Spanish-speaking resident of Cumberland County. Her daughter used to drive her an hour away just to see a doctor. Maria does not speak any English, so her daughter needed to act as her translator during appointments. It was important for them to get in to see doctors because Maria was experiencing blindness due to Uveitis, a painful inflammation of the middle layer in both of her eyes. Her lack of insurance, her deteriorating eyesight, and her inability to advocate for herself during appointments all became daunting obstacles in her path.

God was watching though, as one day, Maria's daughter discovered The CARE Clinic. Maria became a regular patient at the Clinic, and was even able to meet with a Spanish-speaking doctor. She was seen regularly, could advocate for herself, and always

walked out with her needed medications. Maria told her daughter

"I felt like a family, the attention at the laboratory, pharmacy, and the doctor attention makes me feel comfortable and secure".

Maria would like to say "Thank you" to The CARE Clinic for all they have done. She is very grateful to the volunteers and says she will miss everyone. After 8 years of being seen at the Clinic, Maria was finally able to get insurance coverage. God cleared her obstacles and she can now receive treatment beyond Clinic capabilities. We will miss Maria and her daughter but are glad we could help until she obtained insurance and long-term care. One day, she felt her blood pressure spike. Her daughter immediately contacted the clinic, and without question, clinic staff were able to schedule Maria to be seen that day. She received the care she needed and walked out with medicine to keep everything under control.

At first, Maria was uncomfortable having to navigate the language barrier once again. The Clinic staff and volunteers immediately put her at ease and she was treated in a cordial, respectful manner from reception to the end of her appointment.

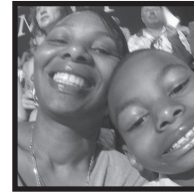
Tara Martin joined The CARE Clinic in November as the Development and Marketing Director. She graduated from East Carolina University during Spring of 2021 with dual Bachelor's

Giving Tuesday A Huge Success



Year two working with the Cumberland Community Foundation for Giving Tuesday was a huge success. Giving Tuesday is a national day of giving that takes place on Tuesday, November 30. Cumberland Community Foundation generously promotes donations to local non-profits by expanding the donation period, distributing a catalog that highlights the 69 participating non-profits, and amplifying donations made through the foundation in the given time period. All donations made to a non-profit through

Cumberland Community Foundation from November 23 to December 1 were amplified, thanks to additional funds donated by CCF, the Manning Family, the Fayetteville New Car Dealers Association, and an additional anonymous donor. The Clinic was blessed to receive gifts from 57 donors and over \$15,000 in amplified funds. Huge thank you to all the donors who helped us raise \$59,000 for the clinic!

An Unexpected Hurdle

After canceling 17 medical clinics, 14 dental clinics, and 6 diabetic clinics in 2020, we are beyond grateful that 2021 allowed us to fully reopen the doors for our patients. We are not out of the woods yet though as we discover new challenges brought on by the pandemic each and every day.

Currently, we are feeling the effects of the supply chain issues plaguing the country. It grows increasingly difficult to locate medicine bottles to fill prescriptions in our pharmacy. This problem is impacting medical offices across Fayetteville as smaller clinics fight to get their hands on the limited supplies available. The medical industry is facing many of the same shortages as other trades due to decreased production rates in the glass and plastic industries.

Our clinical staff is currently in the process of brainstorming safe and effective alternatives for bottles as we wait for more supplies. While the easiest solution would be to simply place medications into Ziploc bags, it is important for many of our medications to remain sealed in child-safe locks. We know that with enough brainpower we will find a reasonable solution. Just like how we made it through the height of lockdown, we know that we can persevere through the many other challenges Covid-19 continues to throw our way.

2021 Holiday Card Donations

The CARE Clinic's Holiday Card Program provides a perfect opportunity to give a gift that reflects the real meaning of the season by donating to the clinic in honor or memory of someone. Specially designed Holiday cards announcing the donor's "Gift of CARE" were mailed to the honorees.

We have many dedicated volunteers who helped by addressing all of the cards. This year was our most successful year yet! In total, 33 Memorial Cards and 379 Honoraria Cards were sent out. The CARE Clinic's patients will benefit greatly from these thoughtful gifts which made a net profit of \$12,385.00 this past holiday season.
