The Lung Bus Will be Returning in November and December!



From 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. on Wednesday November 12th, and Wednesday December 10th, FirstHealth of the Carolinas will be returning to The CARE Clinic with their Lung Bus. The Lung Bus is a mobile imaging system that offers low-dose CT lung screening technology for those in communities in the Sandhills region. Offering imaging services outside the hospital helps reach individuals who may not have access or the opportunity to get this scan otherwise. This amazing service is also done free of charge to those eligible. **November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month.** Each year, more people die of lung cancer than of colon, breast, and prostate combined. Additionally, Lung Cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related deaths in North Carolina.

CT scans remain the gold standard for helping providers identify lung cancer at its earliest stages when there is a better chance for cure. An estimated 238,340 people were diagnosed with lung cancer in 2023 in the United States, and it is the leading cause of cancer deaths in North Carolina. About 90% of stage 1 cancers are completely

treatable, so early screening is essential. The Lung Bus is equipped with a 40-slice CT scanner and scans are performed by a certified technologist. The test is simple and quick, taking only about 10 minutes. Pre-registration and screening are suggested, but walk-ups are also permitted. Eligibility Criteria must be met in order to qualify to be scanned. Call (910) 715-LUNG (5864) for more information.

Eligibility Criteria includes:

- Being between 50 – 80 years of age
- Being a current smoker or having quit smoking in the past 15 years
- Having a 20 pack-year smoking history
- Not having a health problem that limits life expectancy or the ability to have surgery if cancer is found

Our Director of Development and Marketing, Nicole Ryan, was fortunate to be able to attend 3 local pop-up events that CISC RP (Center for Information and Study on Clinical Research Participation) brought their amazing Journey to Better Health Mobile Exhibit to. This is an outreach initiative that brings information about clinical research to the heart of underserved communities by way of a traveling exhibit. In turn, the CISC RP team can gain a better understanding of how community-based education may affect people's attitudes and perceptions towards clinical research. The goal of the project is to: engage diverse communities in clinical research by integrating into the community and meeting folks where they are to make this information accessible; raise awareness about clinical research; address underlying barriers to participation; and increase engagement of communities that have not been appropriately represented in the clinical research process. Fayetteville, NC was chosen as one of the route locations along with the Greater Boston Area, MA; Newark, NJ; and Buffalo, NY.

The three local events that Nicole joined CISC RP at (and shared CARE Clinic information/resources) were: The Cape Fear Valley Health Mobile Integrated Healthcare event at Kingdom Impact Global Ministries; a pop-up event at The Bill Crisp Senior Center; and at The Fall Dogwood Festival. It was great to see the walk-up numbers of those learning more information regarding clinical research. We hope to have CISC RP visit again in the future!

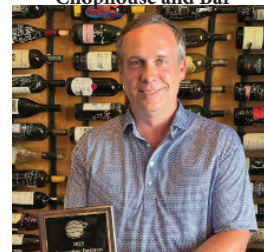
